The new Nordic blue colour for the popular Sunny Day collection by Thomas has a Scandinavian-like modern and casual feel, but is trendy and full of appeal.

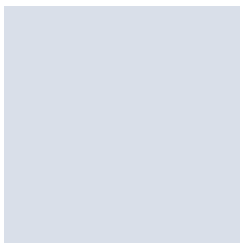
