# Rosenthal Junto - Aquamarine

Aquamarine is widely regarded as the mother of all precious stones. The circular flowing blue shades of the Junto colour reflect water's endless diversity. Interspersed with pastel dots in beige and cream, each plate is unique. Applied to cream-coloured stoneware, Junto aquamarine combines lightness with a pleasant freshness, turning the dining table into a place of well-being and joie de vivre.

Sprinkled over dishes directly at the table, it adds a pinch of Sylt to cuisine.
